



Overview of In-Kind Support

In-kind contributions refer to material, equipment, services, or labor that have been provided for free (i.e., donated) instead of purchased/paid for. Volunteer hours, complimentary office space, and professional advice from accounting professionals are just a few examples of in-kind contributions.

In-kind contributions can and should be included on your TGKVF project budget. To determine the estimated value of in-kind contributions, calculate the dollar value of donated material, equipment, services, or labor that your organization would have paid for had they not been volunteered.
